Distribution Caucasus region of former USSR; NE Turkey Native Climate Cold winter with snow, cool moist summer

Wild Habitat Damp turf near mountain streams and springs over

granitic rocks

Distinctive Features Flower narrow goblet, deep yellow. Corm tunic thin

membranous

Closest Relatives Crocus vallicola

Cultivation Requirements Moisture retentive soil, cool but with some sun in

summer.

Availability Rarely available from specialist bulb suppliers and

seed-lists

Not an easy plant to cultivate in areas which suit the Mediterranean crocuses. It keeps its leaves through the summer, needing to do this to build up a new corm. In the wild the new season flowers may be produced before the previous seasons leaves have completely died down.
