Tolerant of summer moisture in well drained soil Widely available from specialist bulb suppliers. The cultivar 'Tricolor' is a selection of this subspecies

now cheaply available from garden retail outlets

Distinguished from subspecies atticus and nivalis by the clear presence of hairs in the throat of the flower. Along with subspecies sublimis it is a plant of high mountains, often flowering near melting snow. Subspecies atticus and sieberi are plants of lower altitudes.
