

Romulea sp From the Tizi n'Tichka pass over the High Atlas. This is a purple beauty with yellow anthers and a yellow throat. 3 for £3.50

Southern Hemisphere Romulea We grow a few of South African Romulea under exactly the same conditions as our Mediterranean bulbs and they thrive and flower in late winter. The secret is to give them good light so that they do not become too drawn.

Romulea namaquense Rose or salmon pink flowers. 3 for £2.50

Romulea obscura subsp subtestacea Beautiful salmon coloured flowers. 3 for £2.50

Romulea tetragona Flowers rosy lilac with a dark band. 3 for £2.50

Scilla armena Large deep blue bell-shaped flowers. £3.00

Scilla bucharica A blue flowered form of the easy to grow *S puschkinioides*. Pamir Range, Tajikistan. £3.00

Scilla caucasica Seed raised stock from Lagodechi. Large deep blue flowers. £3.00

Scilla cilicica ex BATMAN 012 Pretty blue flowers on upright stems. £3.00

Scilla ingridiae var taurica From Adana province, Turkey. This is a super little plant with hanging blue bells. £3.00

Scilla libanotica Seedlings from Lebanese stock. Large pale blue outward-facing flowers with conspicuous dark blue anthers. £3.00

Scilla litardieri (pratensis) Big froths of starry blue flowers on 15cm stems in late spring. Great for the rock garden or a pot. 3 for £2.50

Scilla messanaica Spike of multiple blue stars which makes a fabulous display on our rock garden in May. 3 for £3.50

Scilla aff monanthos A tiny little Scilla with mid-blue flowers. It was very kindly given to us by Martyn Rix and has proven easy in a pot with plenty of water in Spring and has never failed to produce myriads of its mid blue flowers on 8cm stems. 3 for £3.50

Scilla monophyllos As the name suggests, the single leaf is characteristic of this blue umbellate species from S Spain. £2.00

Scilla puschkinioides An easy snow-melt species but from Central Asia. White flowers with a greenish tinge. 3 for £2.50

Scilla rambourii A Spanish and slightly larger version of our native *S verna*. £2.50

Scilla verna The beauty of the western European sea cliff tops which can be stained blue with this diminutive little squill. 3 for £3.50

Tritelia bridgesii ex JJA1925119 Jim wrote "SE of Chico. 150m. G. Greger coll. (A spectacular N Californian species with wide umbels of big, translucent, purple-blue flowers on stems up to 50cm. high)". £2.00

Tritelia grandiflora ex NNS 04463 Edges of vernal wet patches with bunch grasses. Tight, gritty volcanic soil. Blue mountains Oregon. £2.00

Tritelia laxa 'Dexter' Raised by us from SRGC seed (as something else entirely!) this is a superb dwarf form of this excellent garden plant. Flowering in late June it is a delight for the rock garden or a pot. 5 for £4.00

Tritelia laxa 'Double Dexter' We were surprised to find that we had grown a double form of the above from its seed which were very kindly returned to us by a valued customer. It retains the dwarf character being only 20cm tall at most. £5.00

Tritelia peduncularis ex NNS02326 White to blue flowers with very long pedicels. From vernal moist, serpentine gravel flats in the inner coastal ranges of California. £2.00

Tecophilea cyanocrocus The legendary Chilean blue crocus. £5.00

Tecophilea cyanocrocus var leichtlinii Paler blue flowers with a white centre. Equally beautiful. £5.00

Tecophilea cyanocrocus var violacea The fabulous intense violet form which flowers so well for us. £5.00

Tristagma bivalve A lovely little white-flowered South American species. £2.50

Tulbaghia comminsii A dainty little white flowered species with pinkish mid vein over wispy foliage. It flowers all summer if kept moist. 3 for £3.50
