## **Crocus moabiticus**

Flowering Time Autumn
Distribution N Jordan

Native Climate Semi Desert climate. Cool winter, long hot dry summer

Wild Habitat Dry fields and rocky slopes

Distinctive Features Pale flower, marked with violet. Corm tunic fibrous,

fibres mostly parallel

Closest Relatives Crocus cartwrightianus

Cultivation Requirements Winter protection needed. Warm, dry summer rest

Availability Rarely in specialist seed lists

A little known and rarely cultivated member of the Saffron group. This is a plant known only from a few locations in the wild and quite possibly threatened with extinction. It has relatively small flowers and is of less garden value than the better known and widely grown Crocus cartwrightianus.
