Distinctive Features Smallish flower, white or lilac, exterior of outer petals

marked with 3 or 5 darker bands on a white, lilac or buff background. Corm tunic coarsely netted fibres

Closest Relatives Crocus reticulatus hittiticus; Crocus angustifolius
Cultivation Requirements Cool moist winter, warm dry summer rest

Availability Specialist bulb suppliers and seed lists

Despite its wide distribution this is a localised rather than abundant species. Not especially vigorous away from its native locations, and often rather starry in flower, it is not widely cultivated.
