## **Crocus serotinus clusii**

Flowering Time Autumn

Distribution Portugal; NW Spain; SW Spain
Native Climate Cool winter, warm drier summer
Wild Habitat Open places, thin scrub or pinewoods

Distinctive Features Flower in shades of lilac. Corm tunic finely netted

fibres

Closest Relatives Crocus serotinus serotinus;

Crocus serotinus salzmannii

Cultivation Requirements Warm dry rest preferred

Availability Specialist bulb suppliers

The three subspecies of Crocus serotinus are most easily distinguished by their corm tunic. Subspecies serotinus has coarsely netted fibres; subspecies clusii has finely netted fibres; subspecies salzmannii has a membranous tunic splitting into parallel fibres.

All three subspecies can make good garden plants in temperate areas. Those forms from drier native regions need a drier summer rest.
