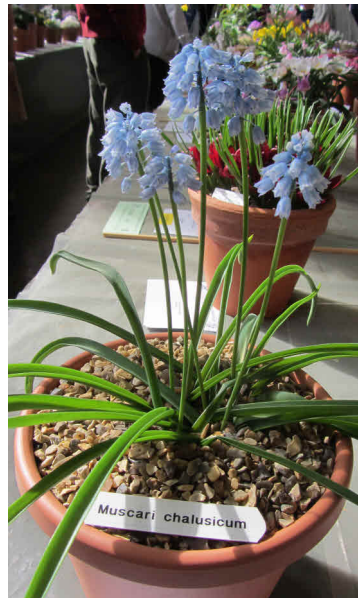
Dionysias. Always difficult for the grower, they are impossible to ignore and found by folk who like to explore!
Note the long tom pots in which Derek Pickard grows 3 forms of Dionysia bryoides



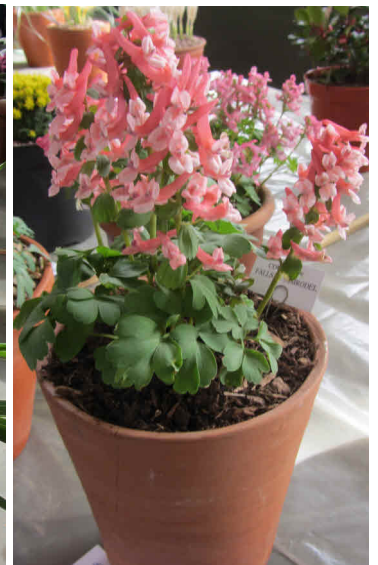

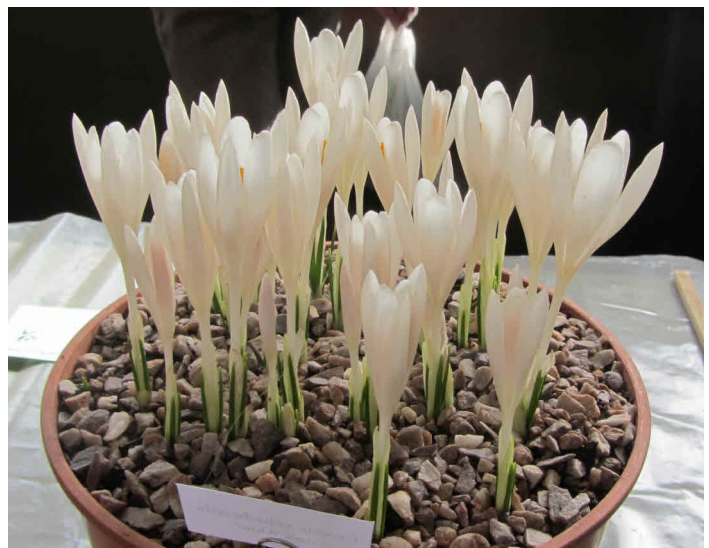

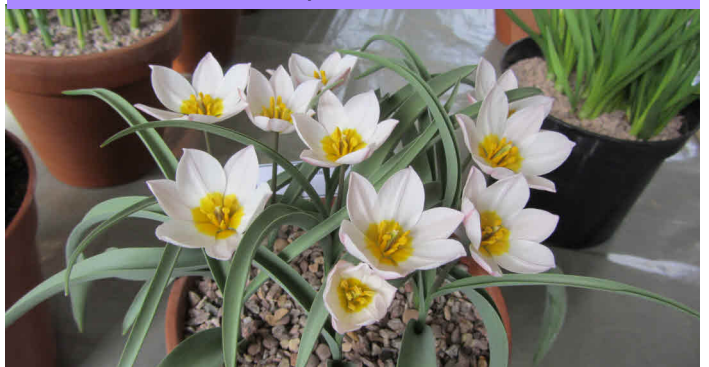
